Some System Level Context - AB 2083

Establishes required local department partners with options for others:

- Probation Departments
- Mental Health/Behavioral Health Departments
- Child Welfare/Social Service Departments
- Regional Centers
- County Offices of Education

58 county partnerships designing System of Care plans/Memoranda of Understanding

- Does not mandate local districts as signatories, although FYS partners are in some cases involved
- State delivering System of Care TA since May 2020
- MOU is only words on paper until design and implementation make it real






SHARED CARE EXAMPLE



IO STEP PROCESS

- CONVENE PRIVATE/PUBLIC LEADERSHIP GROUP to develop an integrated governance plan
- 2 ANALYZE EXISTING OUTCOMES and needs of community children and youth
- 3 AGREE UPON SHARED GOALS for children and youth
- INVENTORY AVAILABLE PUBLIC/PRIVATE SERVICE/SUPPORT CONTINUUM to address needs and reach goals
- 5 IDENTIFY GAPS in continuum
- **ODETERMINE PUBLIC/PRIVATE FUNDING STREAMS and opportunities**
- DEVELOP ACTION PLAN with deliverables and time frames that describes roles, responsibilities and resources of all partners/signatories
- ESTABLISH ONE CHILD · ONE PLAN PROCESS e.g., City Master Plan, cross system MOU, school based family plan
- IMPLEMENT COMMUNICATION to inform children, youth and families of the available array of service/support continuum, including accessibility and availability
- EXECUTE CONTINUOUS QUALITY IMPROVEMENT to support ongoing data driven decision making

EVALUATION PROCESS





DOES OUR PARTNERSHIP HAVE A CLEARLY IDENTIFIED INTERAGENCY LEADERSHIP TEAM, CONNECTED to our Children and Family's System of Care efforts, comprised of department heads or deputies/Assistants who possess the authority TO MAKE SHARED DECISIONS?

DOES THIS LEADERSHIP TEAM MEET or has been calendared to meet with sufficient frequency and consistency TO SHARE SYSTEM RESPONSIBILITIES?

As you think about the future of services for children, youth and family in your community, WHAT IS YOUR INTERAGENCY LEADERSHIP TEAM DOING TO ENSURE that the sharing and alignment of your ORGANIZATIONS ARE SUSTAINED GOING FORWARD?



DO OUR PARTNERS HAVE A DATA SHARING AGREEMENT WHICH ALLOWS FOR THE TIMELY AND EFFECTIVE USE OF department/agency/organizational performance indicators and outcome DATA, and that data sharing informs our interagency decision making?

IF NOT, WHAT STEPS ARE NEEDED to create and implement such an agreement?

IS YOUTH AND STUDENT INFORMATION necessary for service planning and care coordination EASILY SHARED AND DO STAFF EXPERIENCE OBSTACLES in their care planning across our system?

IF NOT, WHAT TWO STEPS WILL WE TAKE in the next 45 days to close this information sharing gap?



DO OUR CHILDREN'S SYSTEM OF CARE INTERAGENCY LEADERS/PARTNERS INFORM ONE ANOTHER of budgetary processes and challenges?

DO OUR PARTNERS ROUTINELY TRANSFER REVENUES OR FUNDING allocations by and between our agencies?

HAVE OUR PARTNERS CONDUCTED AN ANALYSIS OF HOW AND FOR WHAT PROGRAMS MEDI CAL EPSDT REVENUES ARE USED, and clearly identify where certified public expenditures are or are not maximizing that EPSDT/Medi Cal resource for youth?

HAVE OUR PARTNERS INVENTORIED OUR CURRENT FUNDING ALLOCATIONS TO IDENTIFY GAPS AND OPPORTUNITIES to address priority issues facing our system partners and the youth we seek to serve?



IN WHAT WAYS HAS OUR Children and Family's SYSTEM OF CARE SOUGHT TO COLLABORATE WITH community-based ORGANIZATIONS to share resources, risks and rewards?

IN WHAT WAYS HAS OUR CHILDREN'S SYSTEM OF CARE SOUGHT TO COLLABORATE WITH THE YOUTH AND FAMILIES we seek to serve, in order to share resources, risks and rewards?
